School Uniform

Please be reminded that our Nursery children **must** come to school wearing appropriate clothing. Our Nursery Uniform consists of a **grey jumper, grey jogging bottoms, white t shirt and black shoes**. When getting ready for PE lessons, it is important that your child is able to take off their shoes and socks independently. Children should wear shoes that **have a Velcro fastening, not shoelaces**. Please ensure that your child's footwear and clothing is clearly labelled. Encourage your child to take their shoes and socks on and off at home by themselves.

Daily routines .

When dropping off or collecting your child from school, **please take any scooters, bikes or toys back home with you**. We have a very limited amount of space outside of the Nursery Entrance and toys and equipment from home simply cause obstructions which can make it difficult for our children to enter or leave safely.

Nursery timings.

We would also like to remind parents to be punctual when collecting their child from Nursery. The Rainbow Class session runs from **8.45 am to 11.45am**. The Snowflake Class session runs from **12.45pm to 3.45pm**. We understand that there may be times when being late is unavoidable, however you

must contact the school so that staff are informed. Thank you for your ongoing support with this.
