School Uniform

Please be reminded that our Nursery children **must** come to school wearing appropriate clothing. Our Nursery Uniform consists of a **grey jumper, grey jogging bottoms, white t shirt and black shoes**. When getting ready for PE lessons, it is important that your child is able to take off their shoes and socks independently. Children should wear shoes that **have a Velcro fastening, not shoelaces**. There have been some complaints regarding dangerous driving on the roads around our school. If you travel to school by car, **please remember to drive slowly and safely at all times**. Similarly, parents who walk to school need to be mindful and aware of the possible dangers that vehicles pose to our children. Talk to your children about road safety and encourage

that your child's footwear and clothing is clearly labelled. Encourage your child to take their shoes and socks on and off at home by themselves.

We would like to remind parents to ensure that their **child always has a spare set of clothes to change into**.

These clothes can stay in the Nursery on your child's peg and will only be used if your child has an accident or gets wet whilst playing. We have noticed that some of our children no longer have their own set of spare clothes to change into, so we have had to use our own collection of Nursery clothes in case of an accident. **If you think that you may have an item of clothing from the Nursery collection, please hand them**
