### Welcome to the new school year 2017-18.

On behalf of the Staff and Governors, I would like to express a huge welcome to all our pupils and families old and new to the start of the academic year 2017/18. We hope you all had an enjoyable summer in spite of the unpredictable British weather.

Year 1 & 2 pupils appear to have settled well in their new classes and with their respective teachers. This school year we are joined by a couple of new class teachers: Miss. O'Grady (reception), Miss. Rong (Yr 1) and Mrs. Pandya (Yr 2).

### School achievements during 2016/17.

We continue to be an aspirational school and each year strive to demonstrate and ensure high quality provision and experience for our pupils. The academic year 2016/17 was no exception.



Since achieving the Inclusion Quality Mark in June 2015 we have been annually assessed as a **Centre of Excellence** due to the work we do to ensure inclusive education and provision for our learners. We had our annual assessment on the 23<sup>rd</sup> June 2017. We would like to thank the parents who were interviewed as part of the process and their honest feedback to the external assessor.

Some key quotes from the report read as follows:

*"At Kenmore Park, the partnership with parents is exceptional: it works very closely with parents and genuinely listens to them. They are very happy with communication between them and the school and with the support for their children's needs".*

*"The school goes out of its way to include parents in all aspects of its work with a major focus on helping them to help their children with their learning at home".*

Comments made by parents included:

"The extra support provided for children is excellent. They do everything they can". "My child had a lot of support for his speech and language needs, it was very robust. They understood his needs and managed him very well. He never felt different. Now he doesn't need any additional support".

“My daughter is a very capable reader and the staff are very encouraging of her. You can always talk to staff and any questions will be answered”.

“They enjoy coming to school and they want to come back after the holidays. They feel safe, they hug the teachers and parents’ assemblies are very good for children to showcase their work”.

Next summer we plan to progress to ‘Flag ship status’ following recommendation from the assessor.

Last academic year we also achieved the Physical Education & Sports Quality Mark for demonstrating a commitment to improvement in this area.

## Reminders.

Please be reminded that as part of the schools' healthy schools drive and safeguarding the right for all children to be safe, the school operates a **NO nuts, sweets, confectionary, fizzy drinks policy**.

Only healthy snack may be brought into school and we expect similar treats at the end of the school day once the children have been collected from school. We do not want to see parents **bring crisps and confectionary onto the school site at the end of school** as a snack for your child. **So please do not bring crisps, sweets and other unhealthy snacks on to the school site at the end of the day.** We want to ensure that the children learn that crisps and chocolate should be eaten in moderation and as a treat not as a daily snack prior to going home for tea or evening dinner. We are seeing too many children missing school because of tooth ache. It is frightening to learn that children are having 8-9 teeth removed at one time due to tooth decay!

Party bags containing edible treats should not be sent in, nor will staff be made responsible for distributing any party bags.

The school does not approve any leave during term time for holidays. Any application for leave under the exceptional circumstances will need to be supported with appropriate evidence and then assessed to see that it fits the criteria. Any leave that is taken without authorisation could lead to a penalty notice. Parents are reminded not to make any flight arrangements before discussing any requests for leave with the school first. 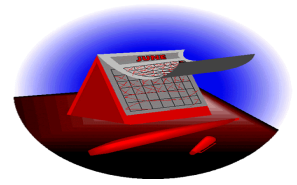

### Harrow Schools Counselling Partnership



This year the school have received three years of funding from the John Lyons Trust which has allowed us to employ the services of Harrow Schools Counselling Partnership to help us look after your child's emotional health and wellbeing.

The aim of the service is to provide therapeutic support and advice to children, parents and staff across the school.

#### **The Space.**

Part of the provision is to offer a lunchtime drop-in service, called The Space, to all of the children in the school. They can come along and talk about anything that might be troubling them either on their own or with a friend. Today's children have many concerns about friendship, peer pressure, social media, body image, SATs and transition to high school. The Space offers them a place to talk about their concerns and gets support. Please let the school know if, for some reason, you do not want your child to attend The Space.

#### **Parent's Drop-In**

In addition, there will also be a confidential drop-in service for Parents. If you have any concerns about your child, need some strategies to help them at home or you need a space for yourself. The drop-in will be available on **Wednesday mornings between 9.00-10.00 am.**

## **After School Club.**

The School shares the After School Club with the juniors which provides parents with child care from 3.30 – 5.45 p.m. Monday to Friday it is run by Kenmore Park Schools and offers parents/careers greater flexibility. It is run from the school canteen. The provision offers parents casual child care provided your child is registered as a casual user. This means that you can phone on the day and ask for your child to attend the after school club and pay when you collect. There are a number of options too. You can select from the full session at £7 (3.30 – 5.45 p.m.) or a short stay at £4 (3.30 – 4.15 p.m.).

We will also be sending children to the After school club if you are late collecting your child at the end of the school day and you will be charge at the short stay or full day rate depending upon the time you collect your child.

Therefore, it is in your best interest to collect your child on time at the end of the school day or register to be a casual user.
