After the half term we will be working on the following areas with your children:

Maths: Naming 2D shapes; size vocabulary (big, medium, small); saying their numbers to 10 and beyond, recognising numbers; counting objects.

We want children to develop a love of reading. Please share books with your child. If you have not already done so, please join a library. It is free and you can borrow books for your child. Please purchase a **Book bag** for your child if you haven't already.
