We suggest carrying out some simple experiments at home so your child can learn about cause and effect and can discuss and give reasons for why things happen.



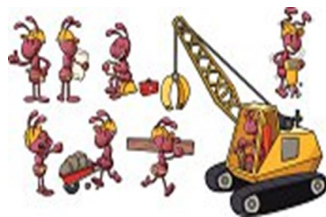
International evening— 5th July 3.30—5.30 pm

Art week

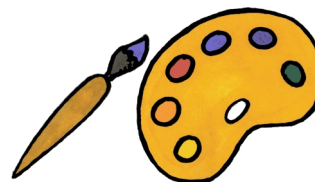
Week of 24th June 2019 is Art week and parents are invited, each day, to support their children with art activities for 15 minutes at the start of morning and afternoon Nursery sessions.
